## About School Bell

Through School Bell, young and energetic volunteers residing in urban areas from various colleges and others, enthusiastically rejuvenate government schools specifically by brightening the walls of wisdom. The volunteers are also involved in providing **innovative learning experiences to the children** through various activities such as **story-telling, tech education, science experiential learning, art & craft** etc.

# Objectives

- Improve academic outcomes by leveraging the expertise and perspectives of volunteers in teaching and **mentoring** students, while incorporating the **key concepts and methodologies** outlined in the **National Education Policy 2020**.
- Engage **young volunteers** from diverse backgrounds to actively participate in the learning process and empower students with a **new way of thinking**, aligned with the principles of the National Education Policy.
- Foster a positive and enriching educational environment by **promoting collaboration** between college students, corporate employees, and government school students, with a focus on **developing skills and competencies** outlined in the National Education Policy to prepare students for the future.
- Enable students of High schools and Higher secondary schools to make informed **career choices and determine their career paths**, based on their skills and aptitude, through exposure to wide Career options at the state and national levels.
- Through training ensure teachers are capacitated to adopt **new methods of teaching** (visual, experiential, and enquiry-based learning) that enable them actively engage children in the classroom.
- **Increased participation** of parents and community.

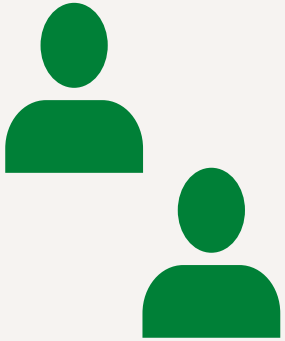

Updating the status on the prescribed online platform on a weekly basis

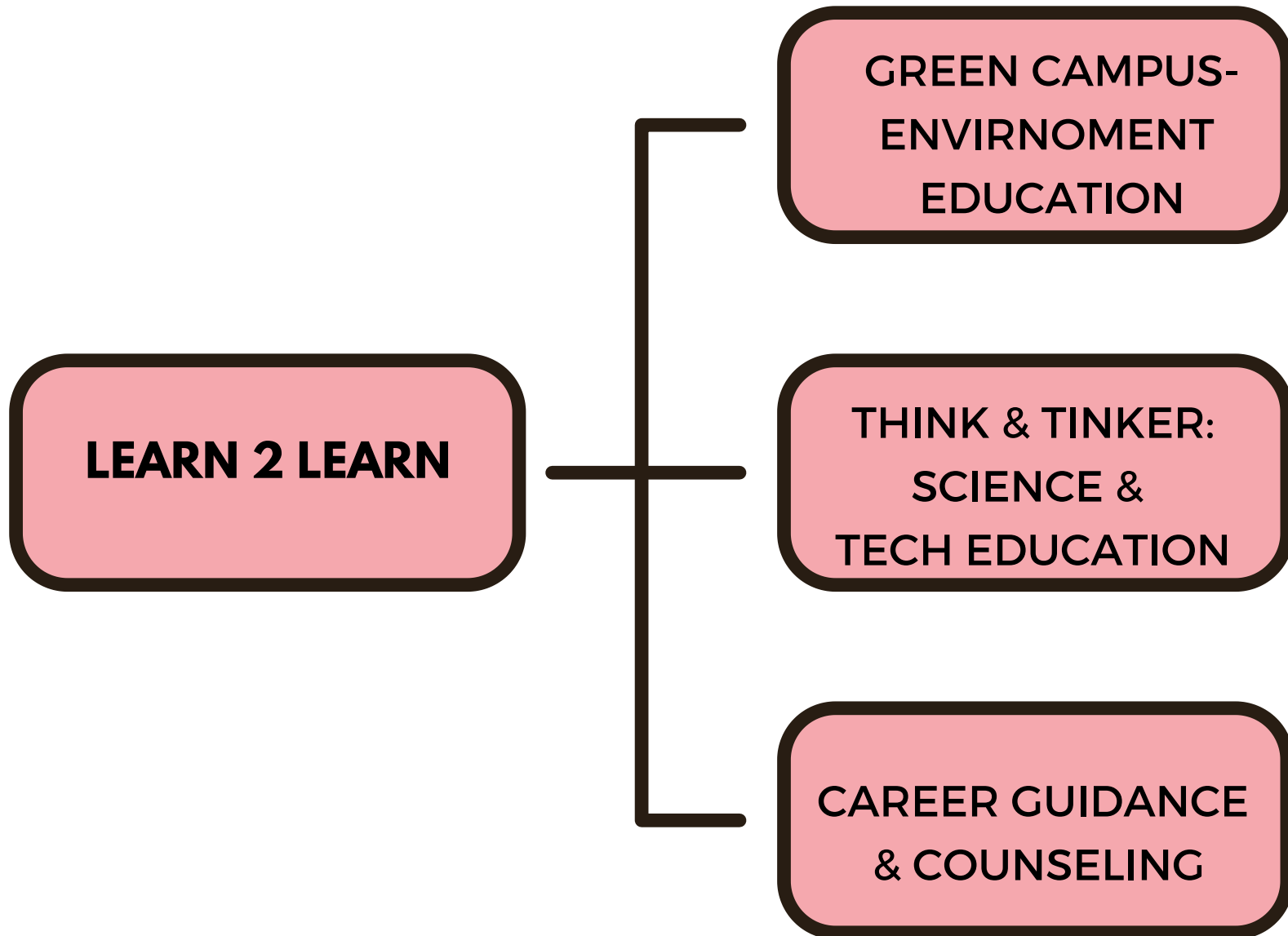
Visit schools once in a week to assess the effectiveness & progress of the project
